

25 Years of Pride

They said it couldn't fly, but look at it now a quarter of a century later

It began with humble goals – ideas people selling the dream that New Zealand printers could learn from the strides made by their American counterparts to put pride into print

Twenty-five years later Pride In Print has not only fulfilled those dreams, it has become the pinnacle of quality and innovation for every sector of the New Zealand print industry.

Along the way it has become the launch pad to success for several companies, making them commercial successes within the print industry and more importantly, underlining their status as the crème de la crème for print buyers.

Pride In Print has evolved along the way, and has grown in strength in two linked but separate ways – in the principle of pride that underpins the philosophy of Pride In Print, and in the recognition of achievement that comes through the Awards.

A quarter of a century later, Pride In Print seems to be such a dominant part of the print landscape in New Zealand that younger members of the industry may not know just what a revolutionary concept it was back then. Or how hard the founders had to work to convince the industry to embrace it.

The key questions of what happened, how did it happen and why it was considered necessary, are fundamental to understanding how Pride In Print has become the powerful force it is today.

The philosophy of pride was the brand that John North and Brian Hartley brought back from the printing industries of the Carolinas in 1992. Brian was PrintNZ President (then the Printing Industries' Federation) and John was Incoming President and current President of Printing Association – Auckland.

The brand spoke to printers about the need for quality, the concept of continual improvement and the economic necessity to beat off overseas competition by creating a New Zealand identity that gave a print buyer an assurance of satisfaction.

John and Brian sold the concept to the PrintNZ Board which at that time was made up of Presidents from all the NZ Print Associations. Their recommendation was accepted, projecting the brand required asking the American organisations for the right to use it, which was given. A clothing and apparel line was

started by PrintNZ which also included labels and stickers etc for printers to place on work to be given to customers.

The PrintNZ Conference was rebranded the Pride In Print Conference and the momentum grew until the second strand of Pride In Print was born – the Awards.

Sue Archibald, well-connected with the print industry through her work at Print Advertising, was approached by then PrintNZ Chief Executive Warren Johnson, to set things in motion.

In truth, PrintNZ had little idea of what a Pride In Print Awards programme should look like, and Sue's brief was to come up with an Awards programme that would work for the New Zealand print industry.

The market was canvassed and a marketing strategy paper delivered to PrintNZ which was accepted in its entirety by Warren Johnson and the board. Sue's vision was to project the Pride In Print brand and marry it to an Awards programme strong enough to gain buy-in from the industry.

This was new ground for New Zealand. At the time there were awards running within the print industry but criteria were restrictive, such as requiring specific materials to be used, dependent on the programme sponsorship.

Pride In Print had to rise above that and be something different, something better – and something independent.

Crucial to the concept of the Awards was independence. At this time there were many different print bodies and PrintNZ felt that the Awards needed to be an industry-led initiative, not run or owned by any one print association.

This need for independence had been identified in the initial marketing paper to ensure the Awards were free of bias or possible conflicts of interest.

Sue was then asked if she would run an independent programme and go to the suppliers to seek support for the plan.

That seemed a straight forward journey. But like the very best of ideas, hard work had to go into selling the concept, and into convincing the doubting Thomases. Just how the twin concepts of the brand and the Awards caught on, is best told by the people involved.

Would it Fly?

Founder, Past Chairman and Roll of Honour member John North recalls that some 28 years ago, the Printing Industries' Federation was considering a buy New Zealand campaign in response to the amount of New Zealand-bound work being printed in Japan, Hong Kong and Singapore.

North says, "At this time Brian Hartley and I attended a Print Fair in Chicago, where we came across the Pride In Print Campaign. This was a campaign initiated by the Printing Industries of North and South Carolina to showcase their industry to customers and to potential employees and investors. "It was an exciting programme and one that caught our imagination.

Back in New Zealand at a federation meeting, Brian and I, wearing our Pride In Print tee shirts, suggested to the board that instead of trying to tell our customers what they should be doing, we could enthuse our members and industry to take a pride in what they were doing and presenting to their customer base, and even the public in general." Sue Archibald and John North went to Heartland New Zealand to bring the Pride In Print concept to the grassroots of the country's print industry.

A series of roadshows wound their way through provincial towns from Invercargill to Whangarei in the first year, promoting the programme to the industry, discussing with printers the Awards programme and entry into it.

"We booked small premises in some of the smaller regional towns, put on a few beers and nibbles and invited the local print community along," says Sue. "John and I fronted these and travelled the length of the country by car.

"Warren Johnson kindly gave John ear muffs for travelling alongside me. We had a travelling roadshow of suppliers in tow who were sponsoring the programme and they were calling in on printers and designers on the way to each destination.

"By the time we hit Napier I remember having to ask the suppliers to leave the room when we did the presentation so we could fit the printers in – so many had turned up to hear about what was happening. It highlighted the uptake in interest in the programme.

"In the beginning, some people wondered if it would fly, but it soon became apparent that this was something the industry really wanted."

And now for the Awards ...

Despite the hesitant start, Pride In Print captured the interest of the print industry, including suppliers, says John. It soon led to the creation of the Awards.

"When approached to be a part of a Pride In Print celebration of excellence (read 'competition without outright winners'), we were embraced by the major players in the market, and so the Awards programme was launched.

"To our point of view, this was a recognition of excellence by your peers and there did not have to be a gold medal awarded, or there could be more than one. This was not so much about who was best, but who was taking pride in what they did and making sure that the result met the highest standards possible."

Patrons and Sponsors were approached to participate by way of sponsorship and have an active involvement with the programme from the start. The first Patrons were Spicers Paper

(formerly Spicer Cowan Paper), Flint Ink (formerly Morrison Printing Inks), Heidelberg New Zealand and Prism Software.

In the first five years the four Patrons agreed to underwrite the Pride In Print Awards to ensure it had a solid financial start. No host association had any financial involvement in this programme, and with the exception of the sponsorship PrintNZ has with BJ Ball for the Apprentice Awards portion now included in Awards Night, this situation remains today.

It amounted to the largest financial sponsorship ever undertaken and sold at this time in New Zealand.

"The Supreme Award was at the insistence of the Patrons," says John North.

Three key elements of the Awards, which remain in place today, were the only real rules. No association membership was required nor supplier product needed to be used. The only criterion that was, and still is insisted upon today, is that the print work must be done in New Zealand.

Design and (in the earlier days, film and plates), could come in from overseas but the print had to be undertaken in New Zealand.

Host associations were invited to work together to form a committee to oversee the Awards programme with an Awards Manager employed to look after the complete day-to-day management of the programme. Most joined immediately, others took a few more years but by 1996 Pride In Print became the only programme where all industry sectors sat around one table and worked as a cohesive group.

Pride In Print was now indisputably a programme that would recognise and reward the output of the New Zealand print industry – but not owned by any one body or supplier.

The Judging Task

With the Awards, came the task of judging – and in the beginning, the size of task proved an eye-opener.

In 1993 the initial thought was only ten judges would be needed, but that turned out to be a serious underestimation. There were 16 categories which attracted 989 entries and the one day allocated for the task of giving each entry serious consideration proved woefully inadequate.

Judges started at 9am and were still going after 11pm, awarding only 16 Gold Medals with 42 entries were highly-commended.

So great has been the evolution of the Awards that while the main categories have been refined down to eight, there are now a total of 53 sub categories and 56 judges were required in 2018, working over three days.

Fraser Gardyne is the only judge to have served 25 years and he says that the process for evaluation and the quality of work now are in a totally different league.

"That is not to say that the judges or the work we were judging in the early days were poor. I think that they were as good as it got for that time. But moving forward the care and attention given to the judging and the feedback we now provide back to entrants, mean that the standards continue to lift.

"In the early days it was relatively easy to find hickeys, poor colour consistency, out-of-register printing, off-square binding and so on. Today those faults are rarer and judges really need to be on their game to separate the top jobs from the merely very good."

Grant Letfus was a judge from Year Two and says the first judging panel had been overwhelmed by the entries and the time it took to process.

"A new strategy involving a larger crew was started. The number of judges grew with the competition and when I stepped down from what is now called Convenor of Judges in 2008 we were a team of nearly 60."

New judging systems had to be created, he says. "From humble beginnings over that period we created specialty teams of judges who had expertise across the industry to judge their particular fields. We developed a system of team leaders who managed the team and took responsibility to train new judges into the system, so they could be contributing from moment one of the judging process.

"We developed a programme of specialty and senior judges per sector who took on adjudicating roles where disagreement arose within a panel. The senior judges were also selected to judge the Supreme Award, with each being responsible for researching and speaking to the judging panel regarding the entry from their area. We developed a system of revolving-door judges where all positions had a time-serve period and the person had to step aside for at least a year."

John North says print companies took time to understand how the judging worked. "As in any process there were critics, who in the main took some time to understand that this was not a selection of perfection, and that it was possible to have flaws given there are limitations in process and material."

The popularity of the Awards however showed that over time, print companies began to understand the concept more and more. Moreover, those companies educated themselves by having key staff become judges.

"The revolving door/rotation process meant getting as many companies as we could to participate in the judging. By being part of the process they were able to educate their companies in the selection of entries," says Grant Letfus.

Having judges who are working in the industry is really necessary as technology changes so fast that it is important the Award judges are in current operational positions. They need to totally understand the complexities of what a client/designer may want to see achieved and the printing skill required to output such an entry.

This however comes with the all-important rider – no judge is allowed to judge work with which they have been involved.

Grant Letfus sees the benefits that have flowed from this inclusive process. "Through this and the roadshows the quality of entries has grown exponentially each year and judging became far more difficult with the entry information becoming a major contributor to the process (age and type of machine, matching other substrates, specialty customer requests). Pride In Print is about doing your best with what tools you have."

Evolution - Keeping Pace with the Times

Pride In Print has never stood still. It has monitored trends in printing and moved with the times. It has seen what buyers wanted, and changed its format to put buyers first.

"To begin with the Awards were technically- and industryfocused," says John North. "It took some time to alter thinking and allow that the Awards ought to be customer-focused as they very much are today."

In 2012 the Awards changed the format for entries from process categories to product categories, reflecting the need to focus on product delivery. Judge and current Pride In Print Chair Scott Porter lauds the change. "When I joined the committee some ten years ago the Awards were very technically-orientated in their recognition of the many and varied print processes.

"I have witnessed a major shift in how the Awards are structured to better present to a wider audience the quality of NZ printers' work across the finished applications, rather than being very print-production orientated."

Fraser Gardyne points to the rise of digital print as an example of evolution. "Initially, digital print entries were resisted by some printers who thought the craft of printing was being lost. Today digital printing is a vital everyday component of our industry which enables communications and printed solutions that were not options 25 years ago. Entries this year reinforce how our print industry has continued to develop new technologies to better support their clients' marketing and business requirements and open up new opportunities for print."

PrintNZ general manager Ruth Cobb says it is the ability of the Awards programme to be agile and change quickly that has allowed the programme to stay current.

"The Awards have evolved and grown as the industry has faced rapid change. The exponential increase in the quality of entries and winners across the 25 years is evidence of the increased pride and attention to detail that goes into producing the world-class work made in New Zealand."

The Awards have also had an eye on the future, encouraging the growth of the industry by recognising the value of apprenticeships.

The Apprentice Awards were added into the programme in 2000 – the first winner to be lauded was Haroon Ali from Imago Screenprint (the 1999 Apprentice of the Year).

The Night of Nights

The showpiece event of the New Zealand print industry is the Pride In Print Awards Night. It has been like that from the start - 1000 people attended the first awards ceremony.

Sue Archibald recalls the moment she knew something really great had been achieved. "I walked up the steps of the Aotea Centre with Ruth Cobb and heard the voices above. One thousand people had shown up to an event many had considered would never fly. It was slick and upmarket.

"One of the sponsors grabbed me at the end of the night as we left the theatre and said how proud he was to have an event of this calibre in the print industry. His wife was in the design business at the time and he said he had often felt overshadowed. The design events he went to were slick and professional whereas events in print at that time were not of the same standard. "Now, he said print had an event that was as good if not better than any he had attended. He was proud to be part of it."

The Awards has ever since been an event the industry is proud of and wants to be part of.




