- Each entry submitted is individually assessed and has an equal opportunity of being recognised with a Pride In Print Award
- Previous gold medal and highly commended entries from the same printer will not be accepted.

The following aspects are important to the judges considering each entry

- Print quality registration, hickies, mottling, ghosting, colour consistency
- Print to cut registration
- Diecutting / creasing quality cutting free of paper dust register with print nicking kept to a minimum creasing should show no signs of cracking or stressing
- Embossing in register with print, (if applicable) even pressure all over free of cracking, stressing
- Foiling in register good even coverage of foil free from bridging correct impression clean edges
- Finishing accuracy (print line up around carton etc)
- Structural Design performance of entry with emphasis on package development
- Carton/case, innovation, uniqueness, and, environmental consideration in relation to required functionality
- Graphic design as it pertains to enhance the structure and overall appearance of the package (colour, appearance, printing quality, bar code)
- The degree of difficulty in producing the entry
- Machinability, processing and handling (product performance at end user level)
- Bar code verified to GSI specifications.
